Walking along the sculpture trail is magical for romantic people and also very artistic and interesting to those who are not. It trails along the Huder Bach and combines wood, metal and stone sculptures with nature, which creates an extraordinary flair.

For those who always wanted to know what farm life was like during the 19th century, the Vielstedter Bauernhaus is the perfect chance to see it. The museum's topic is the life and work of farmers in the 19th century and the food in the next door restaurant is delicious.

By bike you can take a ride through our solar system and experience it like you never dreamed of. The 6 km long trail shows the solar system minimised by about a billion and gives people a unique chance to learn all about the planets.

The conservation area Holler- and Wittemoor, the primeval forest Hasbruch and the Wildeshauser Geest are recommended to everybody: whether you're an artist looking for inspiration, a scientist specialising in nature or fond of long walks in a beautiful setting – the inspiringly beautiful impressions you'll get there will be something you'll never forget.
